







Word Cards

<p>1 history</p>  <p>what happened in the past</p> <p><i>Example:</i> When you study history, you study about people and events of the past.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>	<p>2 historian</p>  <p>a person who studies the past</p> <p><i>Example:</i> A historian studies clues from the past.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>
<p>3 primary sources</p>  <p>records made by people who saw or took place in an event</p> <p><i>Example:</i> Photographs, diaries, newspaper articles, and letters are primary sources.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>	<p>4 secondary sources</p>  <p>records written by someone who was not there at the time</p> <p><i>Example:</i> Textbooks are secondary sources.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>
<p>5 timeline</p>  <p>a diagram that shows the order in which events happened</p> <p><i>Example:</i> You can make a timeline of important events in your life.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>	<p>6 decade</p>  <p>a ten year period of time</p> <p><i>Example:</i> It happened a decade ago which means it happened ten years ago.</p> <p>(SS030301)</p>

Example: The People of the Three Fires had cultures that were much alike.

Example: When people build new roads they are interacting with the Earth.

Example: Water, soil, and trees are natural resources.

adapting to the natural environment

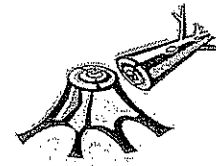


when people change to fit the environment

not enough natural resources

Example: There was a scarcity of beaver furs in France.

Example: Voyageurs traveled by canoes.

Example: British people from Britain became interested in the fur trade.

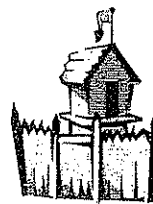

Example: The city of Detroit began as a fort along a river.








<p>33 territory</p> <p>what an area of land was called that was not a state</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> In the early 1800s, Michigan was part of the Northwest Territory.</p> <p>(SS030307)</p>	<p>34 governor</p> <p>the leader of a territory or state</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> Lewis Cass was governor of the Michigan Territory.</p> <p>(SS030307)</p>
<p>35 steamboat</p> <p>a boat that is powered by steam instead of sails</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> People used steamboats to travel to Michigan in the early 1800s.</p>	<p>36 canal</p> <p>a human-made river</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> The Erie Canal connected Lake Erie and the Hudson River in New York.</p>
<p>37 census</p> <p>a counting of the people living in an area</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> The first census of Michigan was done in 1820.</p>	<p>38 constitution</p> <p>a written plan of government</p>  <p><i>Example:</i> The people of the Michigan Territory needed to write a constitution in order to become a state.</p>
